News Around the School

Swim School

Arrangements have been made to include a Learn to Swim Program in our school curriculum. The Department of Education School Swimming Scheme is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The program is conducted over 10 days with each daily lesson running for 45 minutes. Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. It is a "learn to swim" program and students who participate in swimming squad training would not benefit from this program. Students in Year 3 and Year 4 who have already attended the Swim Scheme Program and achieved the "Marlin" level for swimming do not qualify to attend this year. This is a great opportunity for Ermington students to gain that little extra kick start to the summer swimming season with a daily



swimming lesson. The program has been offered to students in Year 1 - Year 4. If your child is in Year 5 or Year 6 and you would like them to attend, please see the front office for a note.

Year 6 Camp

Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion. This rebate was taken into consideration when costing of the camp was organised.
