TIMSS

4T have been selected to take part in the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS) on Thursday 15th November. TIMSS is an important educational research project investigating student achievement in mathematics and science. More than 60 countries, including Australia, are participating in this study. TIMSS is an important activity to keep us, as parents and citizens, informed about how our students in Australia are performing in comparison to their peers in other countries and to compare programs of study and teaching practices. We will be able to obtain current national and international information which will help improve the teaching and learning of mathematics and science in our country. Students will do an assessment in mathematics and science and complete a questionnaire about their experiences at home and school. There is no need for students to study specifically for the assessment as it will not affect individual students' grades or progress in school. All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.

Requests for 2019

Each year, parents are offered the opportunity to inform the school as to circumstances that may impact on their child's schooling the following year. If you wish to raise aspects of your child's placement in 2018, please note this concern in a letter addressed to myself and marked 'confidential'. Please note that this information is only used for 2019 placements so if you have issues that have extended over a few years, you will need to write a new submission. The school will listen to your concerns but please trust and understand that class placement is the decision of the school.

Is your child leaving Ermington Public School at the end of the 2018 school year?

The Executive will soon begin the task of organising classes for 2019. Please inform the school (via a letter or email) addressed to myself if your child is NOT returning to Ermington Public School in 2019. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
