Kindergarten

Kindergarten has had another wonderful week of learning. Both classes wrote a very scary story, which they thoroughly enjoyed reading to Ms Riley! The students continue to amaze us with their writing skills, using their knowledge of sounds to write new words. In Science, they explored what objects are made from. They explored items around the school and inside the classroom. Sport was lots of fun! The students negotiated a tricky obstacle course, threw balls against a rebound net and practised catching, used skateboards with paddle sticks and skipped.

Stage 1

Last week Stage 1 was using informal units to measure the length of objects. In 1/2W and 1A students created various rulers and used these to measure the height and length of objects around the school. This week we are trialling Mathletics as part of our weekly homework. Each week the Stage 1 teachers will set tasks aligned to what they are learning in class. This week all Stage 1 classes are exploring Patterns & Algebra. We hope that this program will engage and motivate students to learn and is responsive to your child's individual strengths.









Stage 2

As we've just officially moved into the second half of term 1, our classrooms have been buzzing with activity. Chat groups are well under way across the stage, which gives all of our learners an opportunity to think critically and creatively and present their ideas back to their class. Our kids engaged in a heating and melting science experiment over the last few days which they will reflect back on, in the coming weeks, when they are undertake a problem solving project. Students have come home with a Mathletics login and password which will be used for their maths homework each week. They will be set targeted, differentiated maths activities that compliment



the learning they have been doing in the previous week. Have a great week!

Stage 3

Good luck to all our swimmers competing at zone swimming carnival this week and to all those year 6 children sitting the selective test. Reminder for all Year 6 to return their high school forms to the office this week. Congratulations to Samuela S who made it into the zone rugby league team last week. As mentioned before zone tryouts for soccer and softball are held later this month. We are trying to beautify the school by planting flowers and flowering shrubs in the gardens which are looking a little bare. CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY – Thursday, 28th February, 2019

Thank you to everyone who took part in the Clean Up Australia Day event. Our school is now sparkling clean and we saved heaps of rubbish from going into landfill and our oceans. But this is a long term issue, so we did an Audit on the amount of rubbish we produce. Firstly, we need to remind everyone about the bins there are at school and what to put in it:

<mark>Green Bin</mark>=Soft Plastic <mark>Yellow Bin</mark>=Compost Brown baskets =Bottles for 10c Red Landfill Bin=Rubbish

We started off by separating into 2 groups. Students from Years K-3 walked around the school with their teachers, to pick up any rubbish they found and put them into 1 of 3 buckets: landfill, soft plastic or recyclable plastics. Students from Years 4-6 were under the COLA sorting out the rubbish from our landfill bin into 4 sections: soft plastics, hard plastic, food (compostable items) and landfill. At the end, we bagged them and weighed each group. As a school, we produce about



1.72 kg= Hard Plastic 4.4 kg= Landfill 3.4 kg= Soft Plastic

In total there was 10kg of landfill in the red bins. This means that we bury 10kg of waste into our land each day. Here are some examples of how to fix our problem of landfill. We can responsibly put the correct items in the correct place

Dear Parents,

Here is an overview of your child's Learning, from the activities they will participate in during Kindergarten Connections:

The Frog who wouldn't laugh (Indigenous Activity)

- Understanding and appreciation of the importance of storytelling in the Indigenous culture
- Listening and public speaking skills
- Reasoning skills
- Developing empathy and an understanding of feelings
- Imagination and artistic creativity

Parachute and active games

- Large motor skills- coordination, upper and lower body strength, balance and spatial awareness
- Understanding of what makes a healthy body, e.g. healthy food choices, exercise, sleep and rest
- Working as part of a team
- Listening and creativity skills

Who Sank the Boat?

- Exposure and understanding of mathematical concepts such as weight, i.e. heavy and light
- Scientific hypothesising skills (being able to make an educated guess/ prediction)
- Turn taking and listening skills
- Ability to participate in group discussions
- Memory recall skills as children verbally recall the story and draw a picture of all the animals in the boat.

Scavenger hunt

- For children to begin understanding adjectives (describing words)
- To enhance exposure to print and spoken language
- For children to be able to work collaboratively or independently
- Listening skills
- Dramatic role play activities
