#### **Assistant Principal**

This term, our school is introducing two reading programs to support students identified as needing some additional support in reading. The two programs are The Reading Tutor Program and Reading for Life.

#### The Reading Tutor Program

The Reading Tutor Program is a specialised teaching program run through the MultiLit initiative as part of Macquarie University. It designed for students from Year 2 up to adults who require support with skills in learning to read. The program is delivered by School Learning Support Teachers who have been trained in the program. Our school has used the program to target identified students in Years 4 and 5. The program looks at developing skills in the following three areas:

- **1.Word Attack Skills (phonics)** which teaches children skills to improve the accuracy and fluency of their reading, as well as spelling;
- **2.Sight Words** which teaches students to quickly recognise the most common words that appear in text; and **3.Reinforced Reading** which gives children the chance to practise their new skills by reading books aloud.

#### Reading for Life

Reading for Life is an initiative developed by Learning Links and Ryde City Council to support students with reading. This is a volunteer reading-buddy program where volunteers and members of the community are trained to deliver the program.

The program involves an initial assessment to determine a student's eligibility, then weekly sessions to support skills in reading. Students will participate in buddy reading, games and activities to develop their comprehension and understanding, word attack skills, sight words and reading strategies. The program runs for a 15 week period and will focus on identified students in Years 2 and 3. We look forward to the success of these programs.

Happy education week from all the Stage 1 teachers. We would like to thank all family members who joined us at school today. Well done to all of our junior dancers who performed during the assembly, you all did a spectacular job! This week Year 1 and 2 will be focusing on the following:

- Year 1 Spelling and Grammar- 'igh' sound and nouns
- Year 2 Spelling and Grammar- 'er' sound and dictionary skills
- Handwriting forming the letter 'u' and the number '8'
- Year 1 Mathematics Whole number: rounding numbers to the nearest ten
- Year 2 Mathematics Whole number: rounding numbers to the nearest hundred

What a busy and exciting start to week 3! Today we had Education Week open classrooms where parents and families got the chance to experience some STEM challenges. Students were highly engaged in designing and building a balloon-powered car that travels as far as possible. This activity was an important lesson in our Science unit this term in exploring different types of energy. We all really enjoyed this challenge and having our wonderful families in the rooms sharing the students' learning journey together. In Science, our classes have started our 'Exploring Energy' unit where students have created a display on what they know about energy and formulating questions about what they would like to know about energy. The students have engaged in Learner Quality lessons on 'I am determined' and 'I am Brave'. Students displayed determination when they were designing their paper aeroplanes to travel the furthest distance and explored scenarios of when they have been brave and overcame their fear of something. This Friday our classes will be planting trees for School Tree Day. Please bring in gardening gloves, any small gardening implements they would like to use and something to water our gardens with. Thank you to those students who have brought in all of their stationery and equipment for their learning. We would like to ask that you continue to refill pencil cases with writing and coloured pencils, scissors, glue and rulers. Have a great week!
